Ms. Amy Sitze is a Department of Air Force Civilian (DAFC). She currently serves as the Senior Plans Analyst for the Joint Military Information Support Operations Web Operations Center (JMWC) (J3), U.S. Special Operations Command (USSOCOM) headquartered at MacDill Air Force Base, FL where she leads planning for Trans regional Internet Based MISO.

Prior to Ms. Sitze's current position, she served with the Department of Army as the Informations Operations Planner, U.S. Africa Command (USAFRICOM), Kelley Barracks, Stuttgart, Germany.

Born in Virginia and raised in an Army family, Ms. Sitze is a graduate of Troy State University in Troy, AL and was commissioned into the U.S. Air Force. Ms. Sitze served as a Space and Missile Operator at Malmstrom AFB and taught at Squadron Officer College at Maxwell AFB. She then transferred to the U.S. Army as a Space Operations Officer through the Blue to Green Program and after her assignments with III Corps, USF-I, 5th SFG(A), and USSOCOM J39, Ms. Sitze retired from the U.S. Army.

Since retirement, Ms. Sitze continue to serve a government contractor for USSCENTCOM CC-IO and USSOCOM J35. In 2018, she became a government civilian working at USAFRICOM and, currently, USSOCOM.

Ms. Sitze has served in the information operations community since 2009. She is well versed in all the Information Related Capabilities (IRC) and how to integrate them into operations to ensure maximum effectiveness to meet mission objectives. She has been a member of planning teams integrating IRCs at the tactical, operational, and strategic echelons. She has contributed to planning, operations, policy, implementation, and employment of capability in support of Information Operations.

Ms. Sitze has completed the following qualifications/certifications: Joint Military Deception; Security Manager; Instructor Fundamentals; Army Space Qualifications Course; Space 200; and Space 300. She retired as a Master Space Operator. Ms. Sitze also is a graduate of the Air and Space Basic Course, Squadron Officer School, and Command General and Staff College.
